Kawananakoa to Unveil his Mobile Headquarters

HONOLULU, HAWAII -- Elect Kawananakoa campaign will be unveiling their new mobile headquarters today at 2:00 pm on the corner of Keolu Drive and Hele St. near the Enchanted Lake Safeway.

A 20 foot trailer will be retrofitted as a campaign headquarter that will take candidate Quentin Kawananakoa into his district which includes Lanikai, Kailua and Waimanalo. "Our concept is to go into the neighborhoods and talk to constituents instead of having them come to a normal headquarters." We will be using our mobile headquarters in order to be more available to our constituents. "As I walk door to door I'll be inviting constituents to visit our mobile office to share their ideas and concerns. We will also be able to have coffee hours and rallies open to everyone in the neighborhood." Kawananakoa said.

With the high cost of gas, the campaign wants to go to the people instead of asking them to drive to a community center and spend their money to attend a coffee hour. With telecommuting and advanced technology more and more people are staying home so it's imperative that today's candidate goes to the people. "Governor Lingle is talking about state employees working a four day work week which means people are staying home more" Kawananakoa said "and the high cost of living also keeps them home so we really need to reach out to them in their neighborhoods and that's exactly what our mobile headquarters will do".

The mobile headquarters will be parked in the area in which Kawananakoa is walking. As he goes door to door volunteers will be in the headquarters calling residents in that neighborhood to invite them to a coffee hour at the headquarters. "We want to be located within walking distance, not driving distance. The closer we are the easier it is for the people to get involved in the political process." Kawananakoa emphasized that "We need the people to take back their government."

In closing Kawanakoa quoted from the Hawaii State Constitution and asked that we reaffirm our belief “in a government of the people, by the people and for the people . . .”
